Shattuck

Woodward

Originally home to Kiowa, Cheyenne, Comanche & Arapahoe tribes, Woodward was established in 1887, when the railroad arrived, and became a stop along the Great Western Cattle Trail. The depot shipped thousands of cattle East and Woodward got a reputation as a rough-and-tumble frontier town. Located in the western quadrant of the Cherokee Outlet, the town began six years before the outlet was officially opened to non-Indian settlers. It operated as a provisioning point for Fort Supply. The Fort Supply Historic Site was home to the original 19th Century Army camp where General George Custer based his troops during the U.S. Government's campaign against the Plains Indians. In November 1956, Woodward began a new adventure – oil and gas production; McCormick #1 became the country's discovery gas well.

Boiling Springs State Park, a natural 'oasis on the plains' was one of the original seven State

Parks of the 1930's. The park is named after the natural 'boiling' spring that still flows and the golf course provides a challenging playing experience.

Woodward showcases the enduring pioneer spirit with genuine hometown hospitality. Plains Indians & Pioneers Museum provides visitors with a glimpse of the Wild West history, tales of Temple Houston, and the colorful characters that settled this region. Crystal Beach Park includes a spring fed lake stocked with fish, aquatic center, indoor & outdoor sports facilities, and more. The outdoor coliseum is home to the Elk's Rodeo, which began in 1929. During the holidays, the park turns into "Crystal Christmas" a drive-thru light show. Woodward has a variety of hotels with a range of amenities and facilities. The local restaurants offer a variety of dining options and there are retail shops to explore.

Woodward is home the first Drone Festival, experience this exciting new festival is in August.

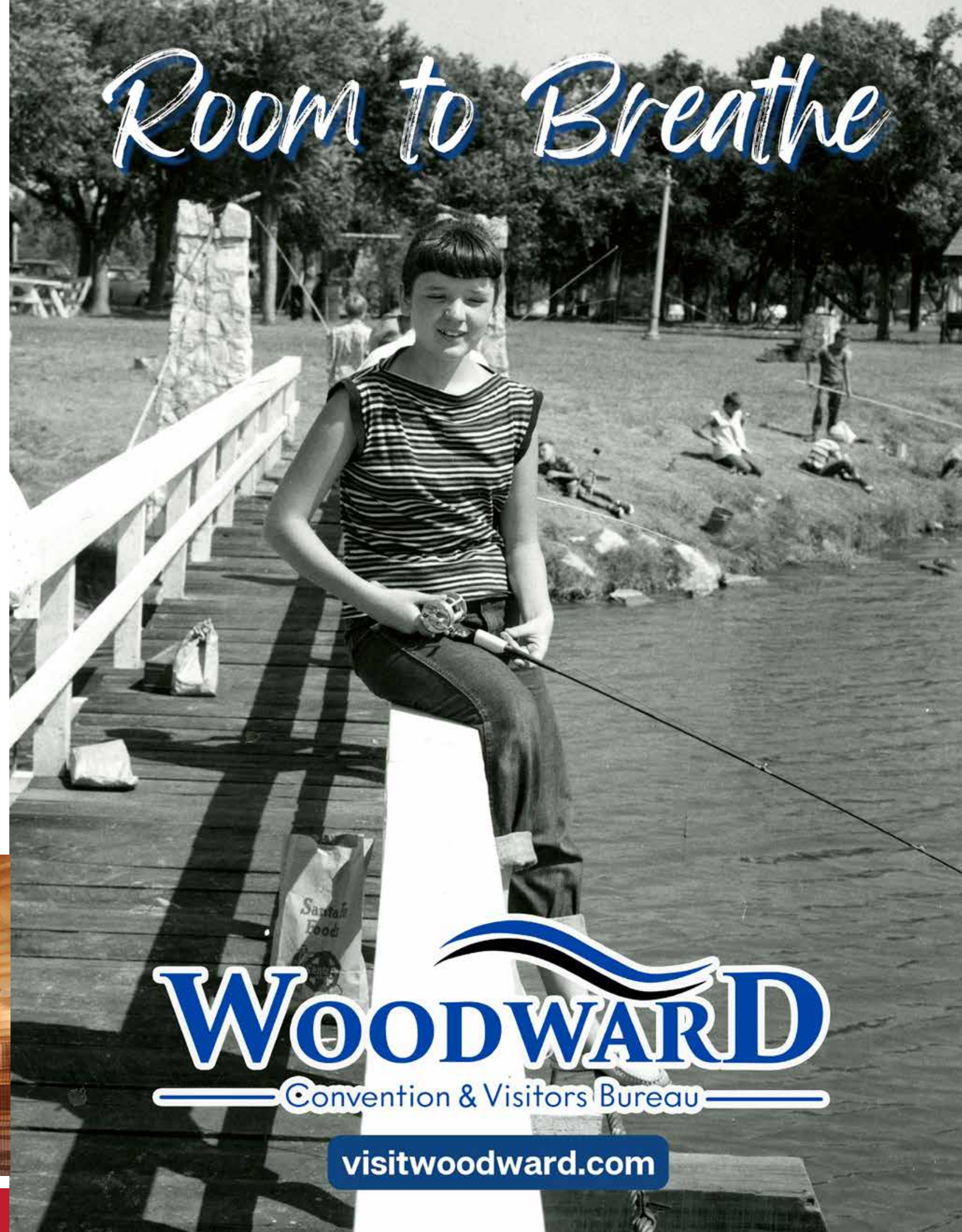

Woodward's story forever changed on April 9, 1947, when a tornado ripped across the city. History would now be measured as having happened before or after the tornado.



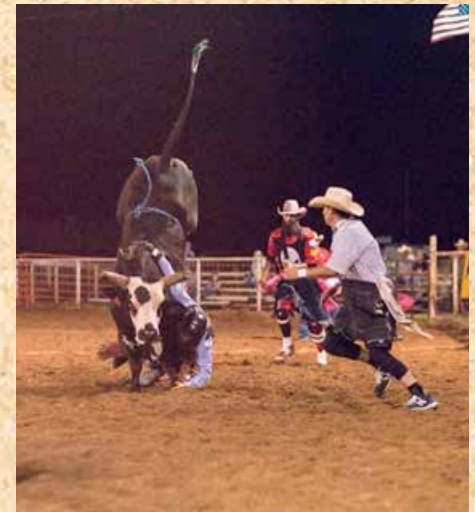

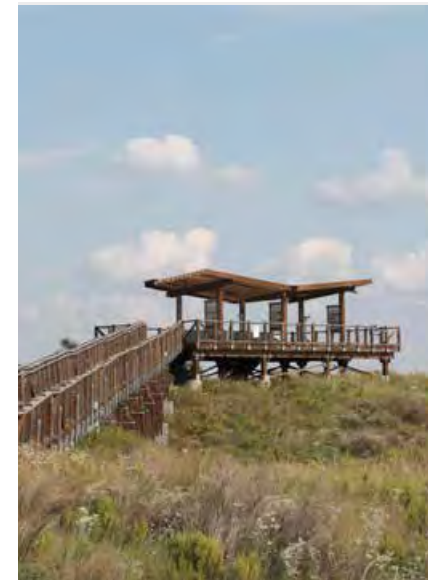

Waynoka

Waynoka is known as the Little City by the Sand. People from all over the USA and many foreign countries come to play in our sandbox! Little Sahara State Park is nearly 2,000 acres of living sand dunes. It is among the most popular sand dune parks in the nation, open 24 hours a day, seven days a week. There are multiple private campgrounds located adjacent to the park and in Waynoka, as well as a motel and weekend rentals for those who want more comfort than camping allows. You can ride your ATV or ORV on our trail to town and park on the street in front of your favorite store or eating establishment, get your fuel, riding accessories, or camping supplies for the weekend; it's all available right in Waynoka.

But wait, we're known for our rattlesnakes, too! The Annual Rattlesnake Roundup happens the first weekend after Easter. During this annual event our town grows by 10-20 times our usual population. Hunters bring in the snakes during the weekend and visitors can brave the Den of Death to get a close-up view. The butcher shop will be open, and yes, you can taste snake meat. Food and merchandise vendors line the streets. An area ABATE Chapter hosts a Biker Rodeo on Saturday in Downtown. Snakes are measured and prizes awarded on Sunday afternoon to

complete the weekend. This three-day event has something for everyone!

We're also known for the Cimarron River Stampede Rodeo, the oldest ongoing rodeo in the area. Sanctioned by UPRA, KPRA, IPRA & open rodeo associations, this event is held the second weekend in August and attracts some of the best rodeo cowboys and was ranked in 2016 by UPRA at #1 nationally for highest paying added money. Thursday night is kid's night, with special events and activities just for them. You'll enjoy the special performances nightly. Food vendors are on sight at the rodeo grounds with specialties like meatloaf burgers and chicken fry sandwiches. Bring your appetite and your enthusiasm and enjoy three great nights of rodeo at its finest.

Two of our nationally acclaimed historic treasures, the Harvey House and the Santa Fe Depot, stand adjacent to one of America's fastest and busiest rail lines, the BNSF Southern Transcon. Both structures are a part of the Waynoka Air-Rail Museum that features the many facets of Waynoka's railroading and former TAT Airline history. It was Charles Lindbergh that selected Waynoka as a key location for the TAT's cross-country stopovers in 1929. Charles Lindbergh and Amelia Earhart frequently visited Waynoka during the TAT's existence.

Alva

Alva was established in 1893 as a land office from the Cherokee Outlet Land Run, the largest of the land rushes in Oklahoma. The town is location on the Atchison, Topeka & Santa Fe Railway.

The Cherokee Strip Museum of Alva is located in the former Alva General Hospital. Upon visiting the Museum, you will find many authentic historical items displayed in one of the 40 rooms throughout the building. Local families whose ancestors have settled in Woods County at the time of the 1893 land run are striving to see that history is preserved. The museum has artifacts from the German POW camp stationed in Alva during World War II. An authentic one room school house is located on the museum complex. The newly renovated country church is available for weddings and events.

In 1897, Alva became home to Northwestern Oklahoma State University. The college's main building for a time was the "Castle on the Hill," a huge, fanciful brick building that towered over much of the town. The Castle burned down in 1935, to be replaced by Jesse Dunn Hall, which was dedicated in 1937 by Eleanor Roosevelt.

The Alva Mural Society is proud of the outstanding historical murals, including the storied Castle and dozens of marvelous murals can be found throughout the town. The Runnymede has an interesting history and provides a community room with a full kitchen. The Alva Community Theatre, (ACT 1) offers live entertainment. Alva hosts a First Friday Art Walk each month in the Arts & Shopping District. The Nescatunga Arts Festival is in June and the RACE Big Cruise & Car Show is in September.

Alva is the home of Nancy Denner, Miss America 1957.

A German POW camp drop station was in Alva during World War II.

Helena

Helena is home to a very large Metal of Honor Memorial dedicated to all services and all veterans from all wars including Revolutionary War, the War of 1812, the Mexican War, the Civil War, the Spanish-American War, World War I, World War II, the Korean War, the Vietnam War, military operations in Grenada and Panama, and the Persian Gulf War. The Metal of Honor Memorial honors 3,402 special heroes who were recipients of the 3,421 metals of honor, the highest military award for bravery or self-sacrifice that can be given to an individual in the United States of America. Fourteen vertical gray granite slabs are used to display various components of the wars and list all names of veterans who fought and died in the wars. The two tanks were both from the Army - one from Alabama

and the other from Fort Riley, Kansas. Burlington Northern Railroad agreed to ship the vehicles to Helena at a discount. Oklahoma National Guard troops from Alva drove the tanks to the site. Prisoners from the 680-unit Crabtree Correctional Center built the flagpoles. Bricks for the monument came from Helena's unused high school, the foundation of an old home and from Ponca City streets.

Near Helena is the Selenite Crystal Dig, at the Salt Plains National Wildlife Refuge, is open between April 15th and October 1st each year. This area offers bird watching and chance of a lifetime to dig for one-of-a-kind fragile hour-glass crystals that challenge even the most experienced digger.



Fun Facts

The "Soddy" at Sod House Museum is the only sod house still standing in Oklahoma, built by homesteader, Marshall McCully's, in 1894, featuring two rooms constructed from a half-acre of thick buffalo grass sod.

The town of Aline was named for Mabel Aline Hartshorn, the daughter of a homestead owner who opened the post office. One of the highlights of Aline is its traditional Fall Fair dating back to just after WWII.

Aline

Today the museum encloses the original Sod House and a root cellar.

The City of Cherokee hosts an annual Bird and Crystal Festival at The Great Salt Plains Park and bird refuge area. The Selenite Crystal Dig, at the Salt Plains National Wildlife Refuge, is open between April 15th and October 1st each year. This area offers bird watching and chance of a lifetime to dig for one-of-a-kind fragile hour-glass crystals that challenge even the most experienced digger.

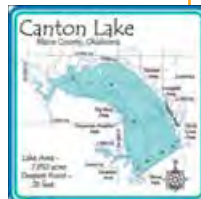

Watonga

The Gateway to Roman Nose State Park, Watonga is 70 miles northwest of Oklahoma City, an easy destination trip. Visitors to Watonga can sample wine produced from locally-grown grapes at Whirlwind Winery. Watonga continues to host the Watonga Cheese Festival in October and several of the local merchants sell Watonga Cheese.

Watonga, the Blaine County seat, has attractions for history buffs and outdoor enthusiasts. Visit the T.B. Ferguson Home & Museum for guided tours, stop by the Ferguson Presbyterian Chapel, built in 1901. Watonga offers golf, bowling, arts, shopping, dining, and lodging.

Roman Nose State Park was built by the Civilian Conservation Corps in the early 1930's and is one of the original Oklahoma state parks. The park offers activities for all ages, including hiking, mountain biking, and horse trails with beautiful canyon views and flowing cold spring waters. Enjoy swimming, fishing, and a challenging 18-hole golf course. The park's lodge has 22-rooms and a restaurant, or enjoy camping and RV hook-ups. For a unique experience, rent a tepee for the night.

Watonga and Roman Nose State Park host several events, including two Roman Nose Trail Rides, an annual Trout Derby, Oklahoma House Concerts, and live performances at Liberty Theatre.

Fun Facts

Hennessey is named after Pat Hennessey, an Irish freighter who was killed at the present town site July 4, 1874, in the last Indian wars when his train was on way along Chisholm Trail to Kiowa Agency.

Hennessey Memorial Park is host to many notable monuments from the Oklahoma land run to war memorials. The Roy Cashion Memorial statue may have been the first outdoor statue erected in Oklahoma.

Hometown friendly Hennessey loves a party. Join us in September for the Wine & Chocolate Festival featuring wines of Oklahoma and the sweetest chocolates in the region. Plan a trip in October for the Friends of the Library Great Pumpkin Patch and in December, Mistletoe Magic hosts bright lights, parade, and downtown shopping.

Rooted in the soil, this town's origins agricultural, oil, and gas which continue to grow drawing new residents to enrich the

diverse cultural heritage of the area. Hennessey is located along the historic Chisholm Trail, and is named after Pat Hennessey, a wagon freighter massacred in the Buffalo War of 1874. His death was one of the pivotal events in the closing of the American West. The Sam and Burla Snyder Memorial History Center in the public library is a great place to learn more about the history of the area.

Hennessey offers exceptional golfing at Turkey Creek Golf Course and is home to Oklahoma's largest quilt shop Prairie Quilt. Visit downtown to enjoy gift shops, dining, and small-town charm.

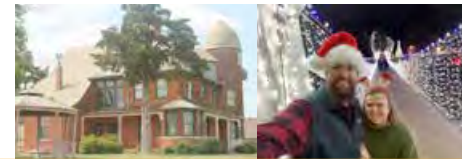

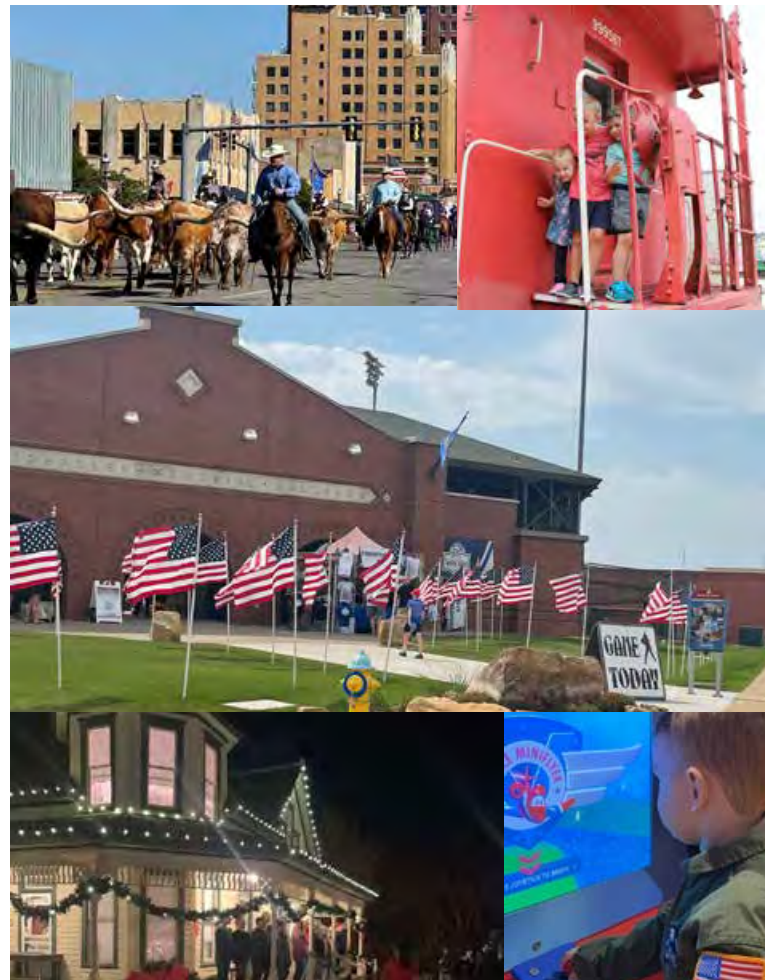

Enid

The arts and history blend together in Enid, Red Carpet Country's largest city. Home to one of only seven Certified Cultural Districts in Oklahoma and the World's Tallest Fresh Cut Christmas Tree.

Enid's walkable Arts and Entertainment District includes the historic downtown square, two square blocks full of boutique and antique shopping, some of Enid's finest cuisine, public art murals & sculptures, and a First Friday event April through October filled with live music, creative artists and themed activities.

The Enid Symphony Orchestra, Oklahoma's longest-running symphony since 1905, lives here, as does the Gaslight Theatre, one of the state's most active community theatres and a free Shakespeare in the Park each summer. Stride Bank Center is the region's top entertainment venue having hosted concerts by music superstars including Alabama, Casting Crowns, Kansas, Mannheim Steamroller, Reba, Willie Nelson, and ZZ Top. Across the street is David Allen Memorial Ballpark, home to the NJCAA Division II World Series and over 270 events per year.

Over 150 year ago, the natural springs at Government Springs Park was known as a popular water stop for cattle along the historic Chisholm Trail. When you see painted hoof prints on Enid's city streets, you are on the Chisholm Trail. Enid was the site of one of four land offices for the Cherokee Strip Land Run on Sept. 16, 1893, the most competitive event in U.S. history when 100,000 land-hungry settlers charged into the Cherokee Outlet for 40,000 plots of land with dreams of claiming their land and start new lives. A visit to the Cherokee Strip Regional Heritage Center reveals a Smithsonian-quality facility that tells the settlers' story in a way that puts you right in the saddle astride your galloping horse toward the Land Run office. You'll also step inside the only remaining original Land Run office from any of Oklahoma's seven land runs.

The Dillingham Garden is beautiful any time of the year and a prime landing spot for monarch butterflies. For family fun, Leonardo's Children's Museum has a two-story indoor Power Tower, and Adventure Quest has a three-story outdoor playground. Train enthusiasts will love the Railroad Museum of Oklahoma, with over a million pieces of railroad memorabilia and a yard filled with engines, cabooses, dining cars and more to explore. Woodring Airport is home to Oklahoma's official Vietnam War Memorial, an 80-percent replica of the Vietnam Wall in Washington, D.C., The Wall of Honor, and ML Becker Learning Center.

Enid offers over 1,200 lodging rooms, over 100 restaurants including more than 50 uniquely-Enid eateries, and an assortment of shopping. VisitEnid.org can help you plan your trip.

Perry

Established after the Cherokee Outlet Land Run of 1893, Perry is located along I-35, less than an hour north of Oklahoma City. This county seat features a beautiful courthouse in the middle of the historic downtown square and is home to several community events including the Spring Festival Car & Motorcycle Show and the Cherokee Strip Celebration. In its early days, Perry sported 110 saloons and gambling houses and was home to the notorious Doolin Gang. Today, the town is proud of its agricultural history, progressive businesses, and home-town values.

Just off I-35 you will find the Cherokee Strip Museum complex with outdoor exhibits, a new blacksmith shop, shaded picnic areas and bridge, the Rose Hill one-room schoolhouse, and a museum that displays the history of the Cherokee Outlet. While in town, take time to stroll downtown and eat at one of the local hometown restaurants. Enjoy the shops and boutiques, and a must stop shop is Thorn Originals.

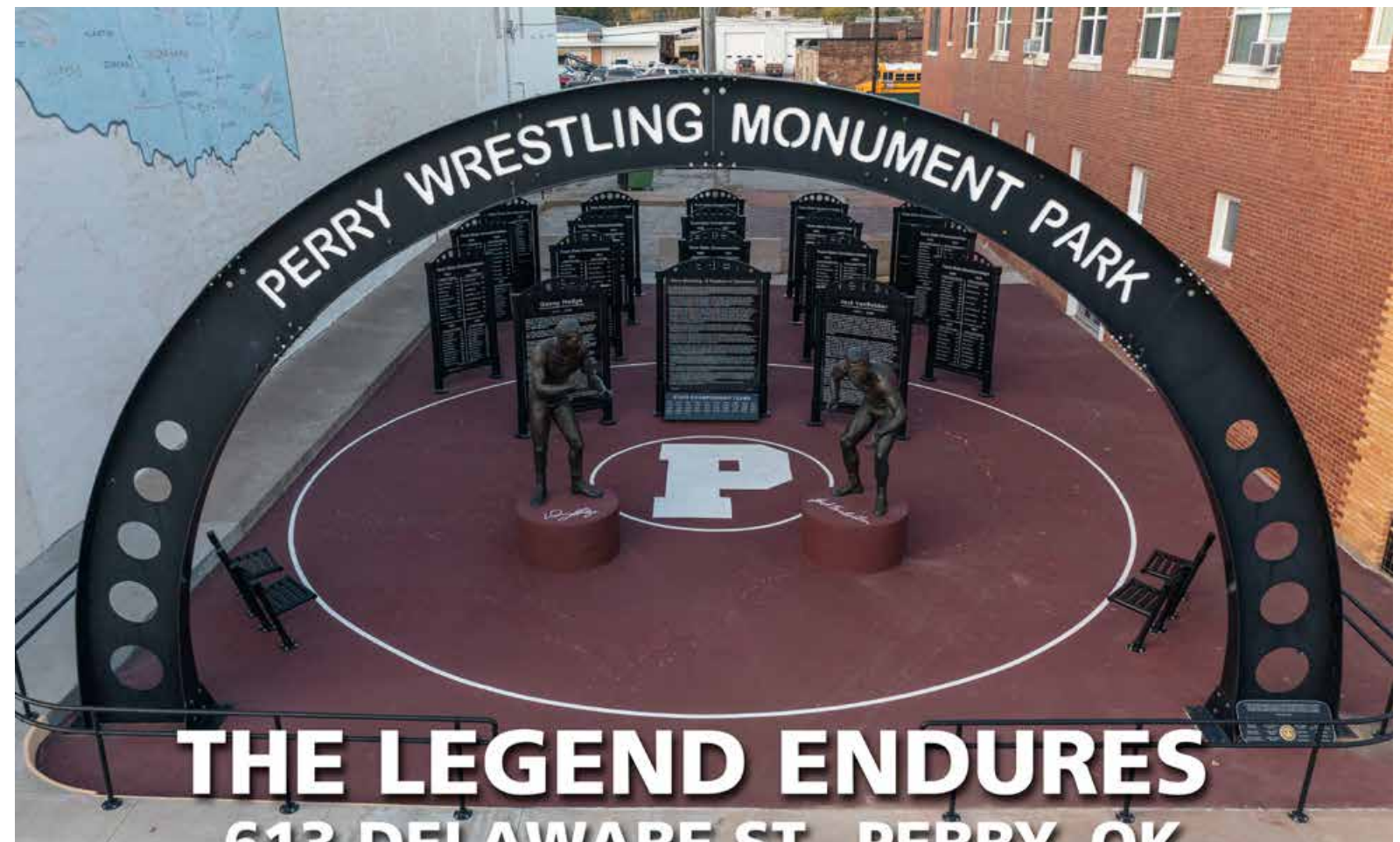

Medford

Medford is located in north-central Oklahoma, north of Enid and west of Ponca City. Early cattle trails in the county included Black Dog and the historic Chisholm Trail. The newly opened 1893 Land Run Museum & Community Center houses artifacts related to Medford's agricultural and local history, artfully arranged and labeled. While in town, take a dip in the community pool and play a round of golf at the local golf course. Medford hosts an Octoberfest each October and an annual egg hunt in April.

Transformed into a working movie set for the 1996 blockbuster action movie, Wakita is home to the Twister (The Movie) Museum. Many of the movie scenes were shot in Wakita. A visit to the Twister Museum provides a first-hand feel for the adventure. Even if it isn't "on the way" the Twister (The Movie) Museum is worth the look!

The Twister (The Movie) Museum celebrated the 25th Anniversary in September 2021. Wakita will celebrate the 100 year of Old Settlers Day in September 2022.

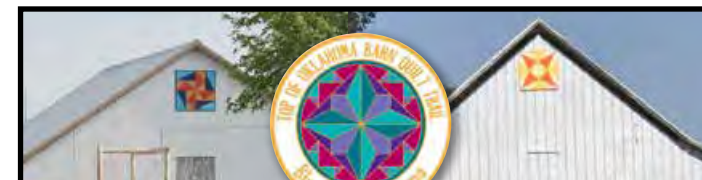


Blackwell

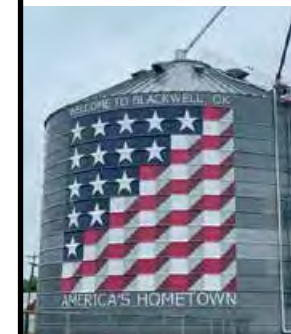
Exit 222 from I-35 to visit "America's Hometown". Blackwell came into existence during the Cherokee Outlet opening September 16, 1893. The town is situated along the Chikaskia River located in north central Oklahoma was built and has maintained a strong base in on agriculture, the oil and gas industry. Manufacturing is paramount and continues to employ a strong workforce. Blackwell hosts a Barn Quilt Trail and a Geo-Cache activity. At last count there are over 100 hand painted barn quilts on display in and around Blackwell. The largest County Free Fair is held in Blackwell the first full week of September annually. The Kay County Free Fair offers an opportunity to see 4H and FFA students show off their livestock projects. Live entertainment pleases audiences while they enjoy a huge variety of tasty treats. Attendees can stroll through several buildings displaying a variety of exhibit entries from young and old alike. The carnival rides and booths and more than 100 vendor displays complete the tradition of the Fair. Visit the Top of Oklahoma Museum while in Blackwell. Built in 1913 as a salute to electricity, the Electric Park Pavilion is a gorgeous building which displays the unique history of Blackwell. The building is officially listed in the Oklahoma National Register of Historic Places.

Ponca City

Ponca City thrives on its rich history, diversity attractions and elegant architecture. In 1914, oil baron E.W. Marland began construction on his first home. The now restored 22 room mansion was designed with ground breaking amenities, including Oklahoma's first indoor swimming pool. Marland's Grand Home showcases his family, 1920's oil empire and Native American artifacts from area tribes. The 101 Ranch Museum is located in the home.

Modeled after the Davanzati Palace in Florence, Italy, the E.W. Marland Estate, a 55 room 43,000 square foot "castle on the prairie," contains a leather-lined elevator, 12 bathrooms, 3 kitchens, 7 fireplaces and an elegant ballroom with a 24-karat gold leaf covered ceiling worth over \$2 million. This 1928 home is now listed as a National Historic Landmark. The Marland Oil Company merged with Isaac Blake's Continental Oil & Transportation to become Conoco, a 20th century energy company like no other.

Opening in 1927, the Poncan Theatre enjoyed the "golden era" of cinema. The Poncan is home to a large collection of hand-painted movie posters from the 1920's & 1930's, all original to the theatre.

The two tallest bronze statues in the state of Oklahoma live in Ponca City. The 30-foot "Confident" Pioneer Woman is located in front of the Pioneer Woman Museum, where you can discover stories of Oklahoma's pioneer women. "Confident" was chosen by a vote from 750,000 people from across the USA. The Standing Bear Museum is home of the 22-foot Poncan Chief Standing Bear. The museum displays artifacts from the Kaw, Osage, Otoe-Missouria, Pawnee, Ponca and Tonkawa tribes. The annual Standing Bear Pow Wow is held at their permanent arbor each September.

Ponca City hosts many events, such as the Herb Festival, Cruisin' Grand, Cherokee Strip Golf Classic, Fine Arts Festival, BBQ Cook-off, Brew Fest, PRCA 101 Wild West Rodeo, Oktoberfest, Holiday Happenings, Festival of Angels and Marland Gala.



Fun Facts

Tonkawa was the site of a POW camp during World War II that housed over 3,000 prisoners and Army personnel.



Tonkawa

Native Americans, hardy pioneers, educators, oilmen, German prisoners of war and creative citizens have all left their mark on this city on the Salt Fork River. Tonkawa (the word translates as "they all stay together") takes its name from the Tonkawa Tribe. Because of abundant wheat production in the area, Tonkawa styles itself the "Wheatheart of Oklahoma." The picturesque Heart in the Park Labyrinth with its timeline of Tonkawa history and the Grand Heart Walk of art panels surrounded by personalized pavers are the latest additions to Centennial Park. A number of historical monuments and three museums - the McCarter Museum of Tonkawa History, the Tonkawa Tribal Museum and the A.D. Buck History and Welcome Center - give glimpses of the history of the Tonkawa.

The Tonkawa Film Festival will be April 8-9, 2022 and in December Tonkawa's Grand Avenue looks like a Hallmark movie with a Christmas in the center of the street.

Newkirk

The northern gateway to beautiful Kaw Lake. The entire downtown is on the National Register with the largest collection of limestone buildings in the state of Oklahoma. Newkirk has the only courthouse in Oklahoma paid for before construction began. Main Street is on historic Highway 77, built at the same time as Route 66.

Newkirk is the home to the county seat; and of Good Luck Liniment, patented in the late 1890's by Charlie Adams, an early day pharmacist.

The liniment was designed to treat livestock for cuts and saddle sores and is still made and sold in Newkirk today.

Plan a Road Trip to Newkirk, on the second Saturday in September, for the Charlie Adams Day which honors Newkirk's heritage and Good Luck. The event takes place on the courthouse lawn and features world-class barbecue, Dutch oven cooking, storytelling, great entertainment, and activities for kids.

Newkirk offers comfortable lodging, great restaurants, Historic Business District, golfing, swimming, gaming and friendly people.

Kaw City

Kaw Lake's 1,000-foot dam and spillway rise 121 feet above the riverbed, creating a 38-mile-long lake with more than 170 miles of shoreline. Kaw Lake is a recreation paradise with boating, skiing, hunting, fishing, picnics and camping. Kaw Lake and the Arkansas River have long been known for blue cats as well as bass, crappie, walleye, stripers and even spoonbill. The lake has several man-made fish-attraction areas and bait shops with restaurants and stores. There are seven public use areas, two swim beaches and 13 boat ramps located around the lake. Campers can select from 268 family campsites; many are equipped with water and electric hookups. Osage Cove and Sarge Creek are group camping areas. Reservations are recommended between May through September. Reserve your site at Recreation.gov or (877) 444-6777.

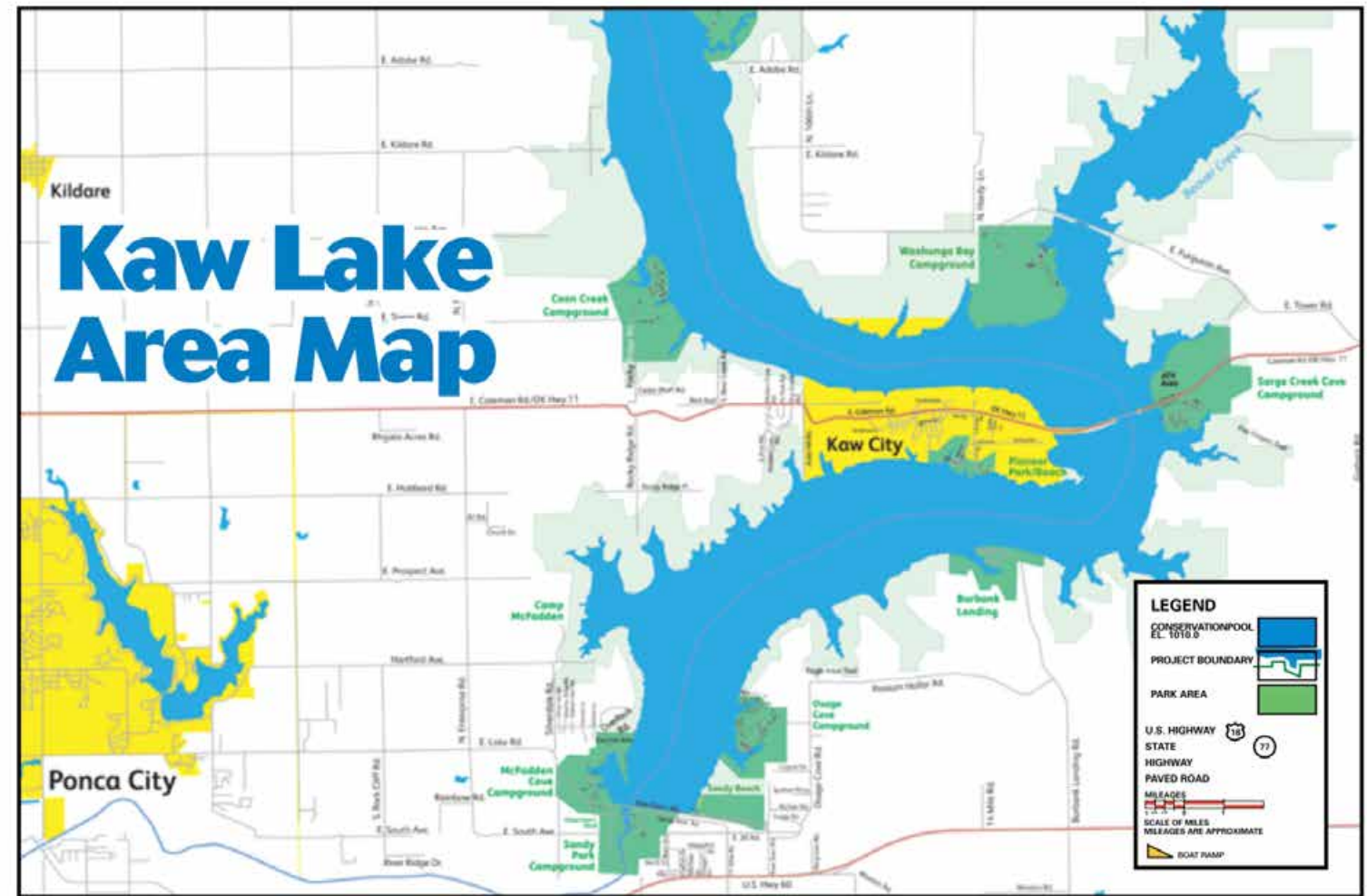
